the welcome Address by Mrs.M.Gayathri, Assistant Professor of English, DKM College for women. The resource person highlighted how the stereotypes are naturalised in the name of culture. She also spoke about how mainstream culture sanitizes deviant behaviour from women. Dr.Supala cited the example of the Kashmri poet Laleswari or Lal Din. In literature she is worshipped as a priest and on the other hand in oral literature she is portrayed as woman driven to lunacy because of domestic violence. She concluded her speech with the idea that a gradual de-gendering can be seen in the way women are being portrayed in media which can prove to be beneficial to women in the longer run.
