Department of Economics organized Special Guest Lecture Meeting on 17-02-2020 at 11 a.m. in the D-Block Conference Hall. The meeting started with prayer song. Welcome address was given by Dr.R.Banumathy, Associate Professor & Head, Department of Economics. Dr.P.N.Sudha, Principal delivered a felicitation to this programme. The students of Department of History and Commerce (UG) & (PG) attended the meeting.

Though this lecture had the potentially dotted with full of statistics, Dr.S.Sreedharan, Head and associate professor, P.G and research department of commerce, Muthurangam Government Arts College, Vellore presented his Lecture on *Budget 2020- An Analysis*, his views were laced and peppered with full of humour and daily life experience to make it an interesting. He briefly mentioned about the importance of budget, that makes impact on our economy like 1979, 1982, 1989,1991,1999,2007 and 2015. After presenting the connectivity between these budgets, he straight away introduced 2020 budget. He emphasized the continuing thread and lineage of Indian budget and the continuation process of all of them. While he explained the continuing characteristics of Indian budget, how history of presenting budget are getting changed. He highlighted how Indian budget were presented in colonial days at 5.00 p.m. to suit the green witch time, and we also maintained it up to 2000. The discontinuation of railway budget and its consequences were also revealed.

He explained how indirect taxes reformed GST is performing and ways to optimal slabs of income tax and its implications. At the end he stressed that budget is one among the tool in economic activity and not the only instrument to develop economy. He explained this, by mentioning various reforms in health, education, judiciary and business environment, which also have to contribute for a composite and inclusive economy.
