While both are gynecologic cancers, they affect different parts of the reproductive system, and have different risk factors, symptoms, treatment and survival rates. Cervical cancer is found in the cervix, which is the narrow, lower part of the uterus where it connects to the upper end of the vagina, while ovarian cancer often originates in the fallopian tubes or the ovaries, which are reproductive organs on each side of the uterus in the pelvis.

Education and outreach effects for cervical cancer are usually observed during month of January. There was a poster presentation after that. More than fifty students actively participated in this programme, displaying posters about causes, screening tests, symptoms, vaccines, therapies, etc. They also won cash awards and beautiful prizes.
