The programme commenced at 10:00 a.m. with a silent prayer, followed by the welcome address delivered by Dr. R. Banumathy. Mr. D. Maninathan, Secretary of the College, felicitated the eminent resource person, Dr. Irai Anbu, I.A.S.

Dr. V. Irai Anbu highlighted the basics of education as more than knowledge transfer, stressing its role in shaping values and character. Drawing from *Nanool*, he explained the deeper attributions of education. He also illustrated the different types of students through metaphors such as sieve, strainer, funnel, and sponge, emphasizing that teachers must adapt to varied learning styles.

The orientation also shed light on how to make the classroom participative. Instead of passive learning, teachers were encouraged to employ interactive strategies such as periodic quizzes, online MCQs, group discussions, student presentations, and field visits. These practices not only enhance student engagement but also promote critical thinking, teamwork, and experiential learning.

He stressed that an effective teacher must be patient, communicate clearly, and view teaching as a two-way process. Essential traits include good classroom management, creating a positive atmosphere, using humor, and accepting mistakes. Above all, teachers should be empathetic, student-centric, talent-spotters, and role models who make a lasting impact.

He outlined the essential qualities of teachers, to remain lifelong learners, adopt a student-centric approach, be empathetic, correct students in private, identify talents, and serve as role models who leave a positive impact.

In conclusion, the orientation highlighted that the role of mentors is to make a lasting positive impact on the life of a student by combining knowledge with empathy, discipline with understanding, and instruction with inspiration. The programme was both enlightening and motivating, leaving teachers with renewed commitment to their role as mentors and nation-builders. The session concluded at 01:30 p.m. with a vote of thanks proposed by Dr.T.Bharathi, Assistant Professor of Commerce and IQAC Coordinator.


